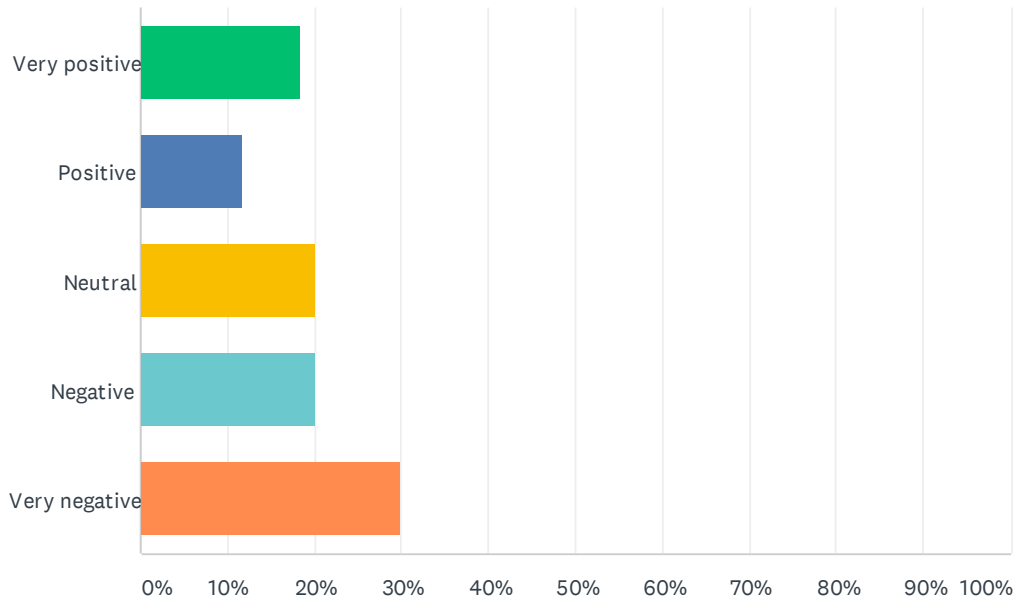

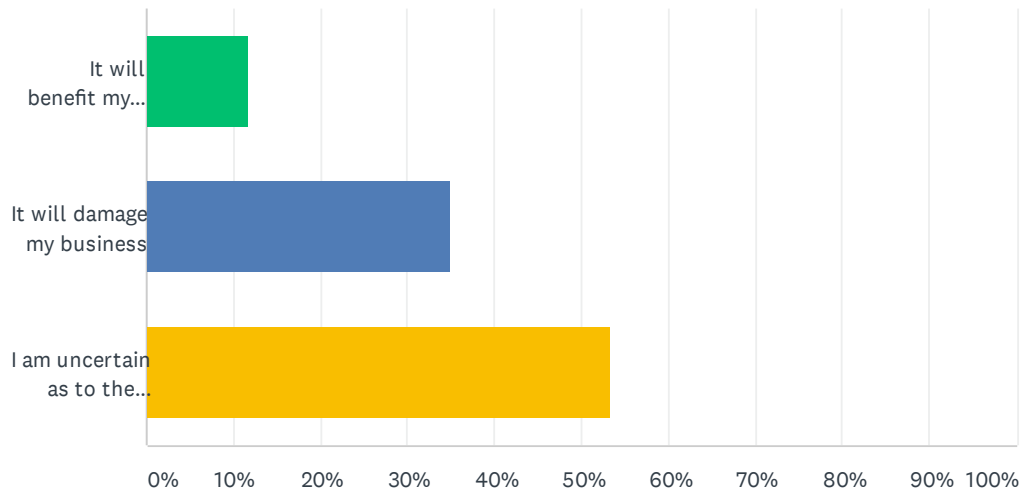

## Q2 Do you believe businesses will be affected by this road being closed to traffic?

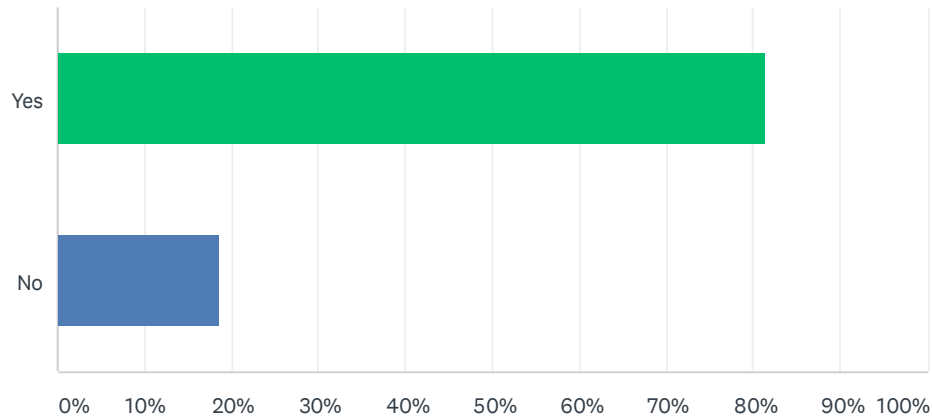

### Q3 Before the States Assembly were to decide on the proposition to close Broad Street, would you wish to see a full impact study on the businesses in the area first?

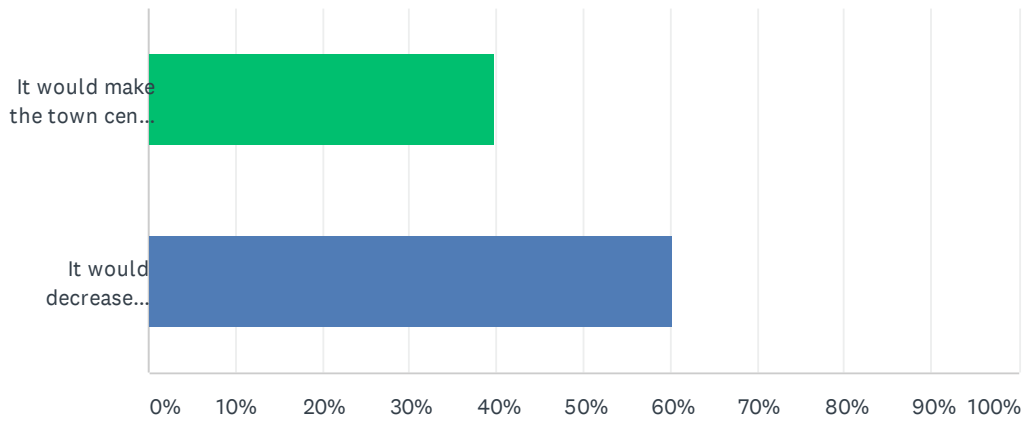
